Please refer to your RTI application dated 26/12/2014 and transferred to MEA on 16/02/2015.

2. The response to your query for point no. 5-9 w.r.t China is as follows:

Chinese President Mr. Xi Jinping paid a state visit to India from 17 to 19 September 2014. During the visit, President Xi Jinping met with President Pranab Mukherjee and held talks with Shri Narendra Modi, Prime Minister of India. A total of 16 agreements were signed during the visit in various sectors including, commerce & trade, railways, space-cooperation, pharmaceuticals, audio-visual co-production, culture, establishment of industrial parks, sister-city arrangements etc. The two sides also signed a MoU to open an additional route for Kailash Mansarovar Yatra through Nathu La. **The Chinese side agreed to establish two Chinese Industrial Parks in India and expressed their intention to enhance Chinese investment in India.**

List of Agreements signed is enclosed with this letter.

Make in India : A Brief Note

India's National Manufacturing Policy, 2011 was announced with an objective of enhancing the share of manufacturing in GDP to 25% by 2022 and creating 100 million jobs. However, the performance of manufacturing witnessed a downward trend with growth rates of 1.1 % and -0.7% during 2012-13 and 2013-14 respectively. There was a need to give a significant impetus to manufacturing activities through boosting sentiments and creation of conducive environment to promote entrepreneurship.

With this background, the Prime Minister of India launched 'Make in India' global initiative on 25th September, 2014 from Vigyan Bhawan. 'Make in India' initiative intends to invite both domestic and foreign investors to invest in India. The initiative was simultaneously launched in the Capital of all states and in several Indian Embassies/High Commissions where time-zones permitted. Few other Indian Embassies have also organized "Make in India" interactions after the launch.

The 'Make in India' initiative is based on four pillars, which have been identified to give boost to entrepreneurship in India, not only in manufacturing but also other sectors. The four pillars are:

- (i) **New Processes:** 'Make in India' recognizes 'ease of doing business' as the single most important factor to promote entrepreneurship. A number of initiatives have already been undertaken to ease the business environment. The aim is to de-license and de-regulate the industry during the entire life cycle of a business.
- (ii) **New Infrastructure:** Availability of modern and facilitating infrastructure is a very important requirement for the growth of industry. Government intends to develop industrial corridors and smart cities to provide infrastructure based on state-of-the-art technology with modern high-speed communication and integrated logistic arrangements. Existing infrastructure to be strengthened through upgradation in industrial clusters. Innovation and research activities are supported through fast paced registration system and accordingly infrastructure of IPR registration set-up has been upgraded. The requirement of skills for industry are to be identified and accordingly development of workforce to be taken up.

- (iii) **New Sectors:** 'Make in India' has identified 25 sectors in manufacturing, infrastructure and service activities and detailed information is being shared through interactive web-portal and professionally developed brochures. FDI has been opened up in Defence Production, Construction and Railway infrastructure in a big way.
- (iv) **New Mindset:** Industry is accustomed to see Government as a regulator. 'Make in India' intends to change this by bringing a paradigm shift in how Government interacts with industry. The Government will partner industry in economic development of the country. The approach will be that of a facilitator and not regulator.

With these canons in mind, an Investor Facilitation Cell has been created in 'Invest India' to assist, guide, handhold and facilitate investors during the various phases of business life cycle. This Cell will provide necessary information on vast range of subjects; such as, policies of the Ministries and State Governments, various incentive schemes and opportunities available, to make it easy for the investors to make necessary investment decision. Information on 25 sectors has been put up on 'Make in India's web portal (<http://www.makeinindia.com>) along with details of FDI Policy, National Manufacturing Policy, Intellectual Property Rights and Delhi Mumbai Industrial Corridor and other National Industrial Corridors.
