India – Cuba Bilateral Relations

India and Cuba enjoy excellent bilateral relations which has been traditionally warm and friendly. India was among the first countries to extend recognition to the new Cuban government following Cuban revolution in January 1959. The visit of Major Ernesto Guevera (Che) to India from 30 June to 4 July 1959 consolidated diplomatic ties which fructified in opening embassies in respective capitals. The first head of the Mission presented credentials on 12 January 1960 in Havana. India and Cuba maintain close contacts with each other in UN, NAM and other international fora.

A. Political relations:

Since the Cuban Revolution in 1959, there has been regular exchanges of visits at all levels. Revolutionary leader Major Ernesto Guevera (Che) accompanied by five officials visited India from 30 June to 4 July 1959. President Fidel Castro met first Prime Minister of India Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru in September 1960 on the side lines of UNGA in New York.

B. Commerce and Economic relations

Bilateral trade has been moderate. The main items of Indian export to Cuba are pharmaceutical products, organic chemicals, plastic products, medical equipment, engineering goods, textile products, metal products, mineral oil products and tools. Imports from Cuba primarily comprise of pharmaceutical and tobacco products. The latest available trade figures are as follows:

Indian companies participate in Cuba's largest trade fair- the Havana International Fair (FIHAV) on regular basis. In 2017 edition, Commerce and Industry Minister (CIM) Shri Suresh Prabhu led the Indian delegation to Cuba. 28 Indian exhibitors participated at FIHAV 2017 led by ITPO and EEPC. FIEO and Cuban Chamber of Commerce signed an MOU for cooperation in 6 priority sectors: pharmaceuticals, tourism, renewable energy, sugar, biotechnology and infrastructure development. At the 2018 edition of FIHAV, 45 Indian companies took part. 1st November was designated as India Day at FIHAV. In 2022 edition, India hosted a pavilion with the participation of 22 Indian companies and 3 of the main Indian trade organisations. Embassy of India also hosted a stall at the pavilion showcasing GOI's One District One Product scheme and International Year of Millets-2023. In November 2023, FIEO led 19 companies to participate in FIHAV 2023. The Embassy put up a stall at the FIHAV 2024 and shared information provided by various Export Promotion Councils of India.

Cuba participates regularly in major trade and IT related international events hosted in India, as mentioned earlier in bilateral visits section. Cuba's IT professionals enthusiastically participated in the INDIA: LAC IT Connect held virtually in March 2021. India- LAC virtual meetings were held on Digital Public Infrastructure (8 July 2023), and India-Cuba virtual meeting on DigiLocker on 20 December 2024.

C. Development Cooperation:

Development Assistance has been a priority area in the bilateral relations. India has granted disaster relief assistance to Cuba in the wake of devastation caused by various hurricanes over the

years viz. aid of US\$ 2 million after hurricanes Gustav, Ike and Paloma in 2008; donation of medical supplies worth USD 1 million after Hurricane Mathew in 2016 (handed over in January 2018); and aid of US\$ 150,000 as emergency financial assistance after Hurricane Irma in 2017.

India donated an IT Centre – India Cuba Knowledge Centre- to Cuba, implemented by NIIT, for two years and later extended for another year. It was completed in July 2010 and trained over 1900 Cuban professional in different streams.

To assist Cuba's agriculture sector, Government of India donated 60 tractors to Cuba in 2018.

During the First wave of Covid-19 India donated 524 boxes of life saving medicines to Cuba (November 2020). Also, assisted in supply of rice from India under short-term credit arrangement during 2022-23.

Bilateral assistance through Indian Technical & Economic Cooperation (ITEC) has increased in the last few years, and ITEC has become popular in Cuba. A specialized course was organized under ITEC programme for Cuba (12 slots) on film production, co-production and distribution, in October-November 2023 at Satyajit Ray Film and Television Institute, Kolkata. A Specialised course in Artificial Intelligence has been organised at C-DAC, New Delhi for 20 Cuban IT specialists from 24 February-7 March 2025.

One more dimension is the Lines of Credit for developmental projects in Cuba. India has extended five LoCs to the tune of \$243 million to Government of Cuba in agriculture, agro-food, and renewable energy sectors.

Donation of APIs: As part of the 10 per cent grant component of Euros 100 million Short term LOC for rice, EAM had approved donation of 80 tons of Active Pharmaceutical Ingredients (APIs) worth Euro 10 Million to Cuba. The APIs dispatched from India in the first week of June arrived at Mariel Port in Havana on 30th July. The APIs were formally handed over on 8th August 2024 by Ambassador Mr. T. Armstrong Changsan to Dr. Mayda Mauri Perez, President of BioCubaFarma in the presence Ms. Deborah Rivas Saavedra, Vice Minister of Foreign Trade and Foreign Investment and Mr. Ariel Lorenzo, Director for Asia and Oceania Division, Ministry of Foreign Affairs at the premises of "8 de Marzo" Pharmaceutical plant. The gesture of donation of APIs was well-appreciated. The donation of these APIs will enable the Cuban drug manufacturers to produce antibiotics, which will be sufficient to address the shortage of antibiotics for 6 months up to 1 year.

HADR Assistance: HADR assistance in the form of anti-biotic and essential medicines for US\$1 Million in the wake of the October-November 2024 devasting hurricanes 'Oscar' & 'Rafael' and earthquakes, was provided to Cuba in January 2025.

D. Energy Cooperation:

Energy cooperation is an important element of India-Cuba relations. Cuba is a member country and the Vice-President of Latin America & the Caribbean region at International Solar Alliance (ISA). Government of India has extended Lines of Credit for 3 projects in Cuba related to the field viz. US\$ 90 million 50 MW Power Co-generation Project at 30 November Sugar Mill, US\$ 75 million 75 MW Photovoltaic solar power projects, US\$ 70 million 51 MW Wind Energy Farm project at Rio Seco. While the DPRs for the Power Co-generation Project and Photovoltaic solar power projects is under the consideration of the Ministry, none of the 4 companies could qualify for the Wind Energy Farm project.

E. Science & Technology, Biotechnology and Health:

India-Cuba relations in the field of S&T and Health have been strengthened by ministerial level visits from both sides. Both countries have collaborated in these fields under various agreements viz. MOU on cooperation in the field of Health and Medicine; the MoU on cooperation in the field of Traditional Systems of Medicine and Homeopathy; and the MoU on Cooperation in the field of Biotechnology.

Interest in Ayurveda and Indian Naturopathy is increasing in Cuba. Under the bilateral collaboration, a Panchakarma Centre was established in Cuba, at the International Health Centre "La Pradera" on 6 November 2019. Ministry of AYUSH deployed one Ayurveda expert and two Ayurveda therapists on short term deputation to assist the Centre.

Cuba participated in the 1st Global Summit on natural and traditional medicine by WHO in India on 18 August 2023. Ministry of Public Health (MINSAP) showcased, at the exhibition area for the Pan American Health Organization, the integration of traditional practices in the health sector.

International Day of Yoga and Ayurveda Day are celebrated in Cuba every year with the support of Cuban government. The 6th Ayurveda Day, on 10 November 2023, was celebrated in association with Manuel Fajardo Medical School, Havana. The 7th International Day of Yoga was celebrated on 25 June 2024 at Colosio de la Ciudad Deportiva, the biggest stadium in Havana.

F. Cultural relations:

Indian culture and civilization is well appreciated in Cuba. Mahatma Gandhi, Nehru and Tagore occupy a special place in Cuba. ICCR donated a bust of Mahatma Gandhi and

a bust of Tagore, which are placed in prominent locations in Havana. Mahatma Gandhi's 150th birth anniversary was celebrated in Havana with a solemn ceremony at the Gandhi Park.

The depth and variety of Indian dance, music and cinema are well known in Cuba. The House of Asia in Havana organizes cultural events – exhibitions, film shows, talks -on India and has a hall dedicated to India where Indian art and craft objects are permanently displayed. An Indian movie is broadcast on Sundays on national television.

Multiple ICCR sponsored cultural troupes have visited Cuba. Besides, several cultural activities have been organised in Cuba; Week-long Indian Food Festivals in December 2011, January-February 2013, February 2014, and August 2017; Indian Film Festival Week in May 2013; Festival of Indian Culture in October-November 2013 etc.

India was the 'Guest of Honour' country for 24th Havana International Book Fair held in February 2015. Cuba's choir group Erfeon Choir Santiago won the first prize in the International Choral Festival organized by ICCR in December 2020. Cuban dance group 'Conjunto Folklorico Nacional' participated in the 7th India-International Folk Dance & Music Festival, by ICCR, in India in November 2023.

Yoga and Vipassana meditation are practiced. With the support of Cuba's INDER (National Institute of Sports, Physical Education and Recreation), Embassy of India has been organizing events related to yoga, including on the International Day of Yoga. From September 2022-August 2023, Indian Council for Cultural Relations deployed a Teacher of Indian Culture at Embassy of India in Havana, to promote yoga and Indian culture among Cubans. Cubans cherish the cultural performances of India on various occasions, for example national day celebrations. Indian festivals like Holi, Diwali etc. are also celebrated by the Embassy with the enthusiastic participation of Cuban population.

G. Indian Community:

Indian Community in Cuba is small. One of the components of the community is the people of Indian origin, descendants of Indians who came to Cuba in the early twentieth century from Jamaica and other part of the West Indies to work on sugarcane plantations. They are settled mostly in Guantanamo province in Eastern Cuba (no official record though). They have been totally assimilated into the local community. Since last eight years, there are Indian labourers as part of an international company working on various real estate construction projects in Cuba.
